QUICK FACTS

- 57% of Ask Izzy users are women
- 20% of users seeking housing support on Ask Izzy are women and children escaping family violence
- Over 2 million searches on Ask Izzy since launch
- Family and domestic violence is a leading cause of homelessness for women and children*
- 72,000 women, 34,000 children and 9,000 men sought homelessness services in 2016-17 due to family/ domestic violence*
- Intimate partner violence causes more illness, disability and deaths than any other risk factor for women aged 25-44*
- 1 in 5 (1.7 million) women have been sexually assaulted and/ or threatened since age 15*











About Ask Izzy

Ask Izzy is a mobile website that connects people in need with housing, a meal, money help, health and wellbeing services, family violence support, counselling and much more.

It is free and anonymous, with over 360,000 services listed across Australia.

Ask Izzy is also free to use on the Telstra mobile network. This means people don't need to rely on having credit or access to free wifi in order to use the site.

Developed by Infoxchange in partnership with Google, realestate.com.au and News Corp Australia, Ask Izzy was co-designed with people who have experienced homelessness and leaders in the homelessness sector.

Since its launch by Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull in 2016, the site has had more than 2 million searches.

Providing safer family violence support

Our data shows us that people leaving family violence are some of the biggest users of Ask Izzy.

That's why we've made Ask Izzy safer and easier to use for people experiencing family violence.

Designed by the community, for the community, the enhanced Ask Izzy site empowers and connects more people experiencing family violence to find the support they need.

The enhancements have been made through the Ask Izzy Help at Hand project funded by NAB's philanthropic arm, the NAB Foundation.

As well as helping people experiencing violence to safely find support services, Ask Izzy is also an invaluable tool for organisations to make referrals.

And unlike specific family violence websites, Ask Izzy helps people who may

not realise that they are experiencing family violence to find general assistance with housing, food or other essential services.

The enhanced Ask Izzy site includes:

- A new domestic and family violence search category
- Multiple pathways to family violence services
- Quick exit button to quickly close the site without raising suspicion
- Safety screening questions to help people in immediate danger
- Emergency state and national numbers
- Best practice technology safety tips and warnings for users




